Do you not understand this parable? is a question Jesus posed to his disciples (Mark 4:13). Just as the first disciples often did not understand Jesus' many parables, so it is for listeners and readers nearly two thousand years later. In *Parables of the Kingdom*, Mary Ann Getty-Sullivan helps readers to hear and see and understand the parables of Jesus. She offers a general introduction to the use of parables in the life and ministry of Jesus and the early church. In addition, Getty-Sullivan helps readers learn to interpret parables, to enter into what the parables can reveal about Jesus and his audience, about the evangelists and their communities, and about how we are to understand the Kingdom of God today. *Parables of the Kingdom* helps us hear and see Jesus' parables with new eyes and renewed hearts 'thereby allowing the parables to transform our lives and help us respond with new conviction to the gospel's power in our world. Mary Ann Getty-Sullivan holds an S.T.D. from the Catholic University of Louvain in Belgium. She has been teaching New Testament courses in colleges and seminaries for more than thirty years and has recently retired from teaching full time to devote more time to writing and lecturing. Mary Ann has written several commentaries on the Letters of Saint Paul. Her recent books include *Women in the New Testament* published by Liturgical Press.

The author on many occasions quotes the original Greek text of the Bible, in order to confer clarity to a given verse. In all, Trench's commentary is replete with expertise both on the Christian theology and the virtues long promoted in the Bible. The moral lessons definitive of Christ, and the historical and social context of the stories, receive a superb and thorough treatment by a well-read, authoritative and lifelong student of the Lord. The author was a well-known figure in English society during the 19th century. He presided over the Church of England at a time when Britain became industrialized, and when relations with Ireland broke down in the wake of the Potato Famine. The disestablishment of the Irish church was a major setback for Archbishop Trench - a Dubliner - however he continued to promote good understanding between all Christians, and published poetry - generally on religious themes - throughout his life.

Nearly a third of the words of Jesus recorded in the four gospels are found in his parables, and the rich imagery of these stories has inspired countless works of art throughout the centuries. Siegfried Goebel's book contains an exhaustive study and detailed analysis of these parables. A critical introduction defines "parable" and places Jesus in the context of religious instruction in first-century Palestine. Even among those who are not Christians, Jesus' parables remain some of the best known stories in the world.

Notes on the Parables of Our Lord Ninth edition, carefully revised

This book is a study of the parables unique to the Third Gospel, aiming in particular to establish a link between Luke's choice of these parables and his overall purpose in writing. In comparison to the synoptic kingdom parables, one distinguishing feature of the Lukan parables is their more personal portrait of the character and the nature of God himself. Luke's desire is to demonstrate to his readers, whoever they are, that in Christianity the realization of the Jewish hope has occurred. The parables promote this idea by offering both continuity (OT) and contrast (contemporary Judaism) in their portrait of God. Thus, as well as operating in a parenetic sense, the parables also help to legitimize Luke's argument regarding fulfillment.
